ARCHIVES

The Illinois Regional Archives Depository (IRAD) is a repository of selected governmental records for Chicago and Cook County from the late 1800s to the early 1900s. The collection includes: birth, death, and marriage certificates; Chicago Police Film Censorship Board records; and Chicago Police Homicide Records up to 1930.

IRAD is located on the Lower Level of the Ronald Williams Library. IRAD is open M-F from 9 am to 4 pm. Call (773) 442-4506 for more information.
