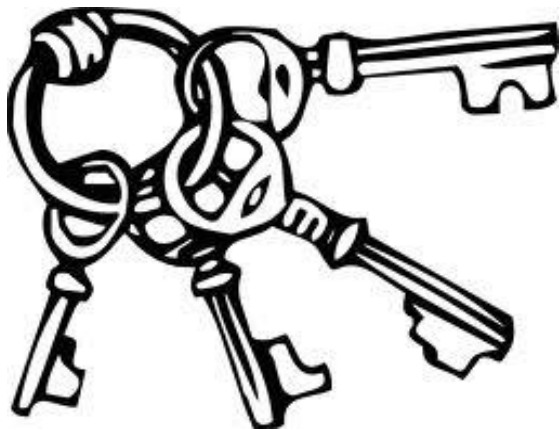

## REMEMBER THE KEYS TO FINDING A TOPIC AND RESEARCH QUESTION

- **IT'S HISTORY** – It happened at least 25 years ago.
- **IT'S GOT SOURCES** – It has plenty of primary and secondary sources.
- **IT'S LOCAL** – The topic is rooted in Chicago.
- **IT'S SIGNIFICANT** – It connects to bigger themes in history.
- **IT'S GOT SOUL** – You care about it!
- **IT DEMANDS INTERPRETATION** – There's a "big idea" that you want to communicate – not just facts. Interpretation means making an argument based on evidence.
